

# Icebreaker Questions For 4-Year College Option

- When are you happiest? What are you doing and who are you with?
- What is your favorite thing to do by yourself?
- If you had more time in your schedule, what would you do with it?
- What do you look forward to at school? Outside of school?
- What is your favorite class?
- What do you like best about school? What do you find challenging?
- What's the most interesting thing you have ever learned about?

- What is something you are proud of accomplishing?
- What would your ideal career be?
- What are some problems you see in your world that you want to help solve?
- What would you like to be known or remembered for?
- What are you most excited about when you think of going to college?
